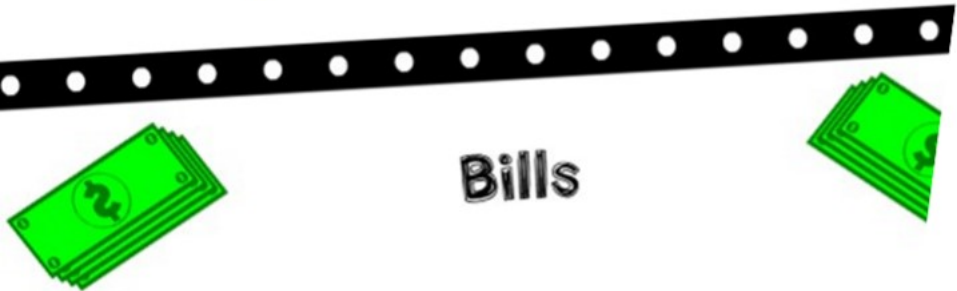


How will you get to work?

## You have become a Pet Owner!

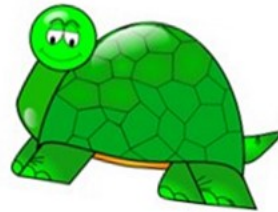
You are allowed to own any pet that is legal to have in your household home. Although, if you are renting be sure to check your landlord's rules, do they allow pets at the house?
